



Summary and Conclusions

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OBSERVATIONS (1)

- a variety of national approaches and models in the field of maintenance of cadastre on the market;
- PPP approach is the most common approach with different sharing of roles; public sector guidance;
- EU internal market leads toward liberalization – surveyor's market can not remain isolated;
- European trends in cadastre: towards a regulated market – it is a market driven approach to what extent (technical, legal part);



OBSERVATIONS (2)

- o national guided legislation, no general EU-directive;
- o influence: Directive on the recognition of professional qualifications (adopted 2005, in force: 20 October 2007) and a Directive on services in the internal market (expected to be adopted in 2006/2007);
- o summary: very well presented as a result of break-out sessions



CONCLUSIONS (1)

- **general: acknowledgement of globalization and its impacts on the profession;**
- **continue with the process of learning from each other, dissemination of knowledge and the best practice exchange;**
- **continue a PPP dialogue/cooperation on national and international level, foreseen follow-up: EG CExG, WPLA – GE , CLGE (technical and legal education and training, code of conduct, cadastral & land registry matters);**



CONCLUSIONS (2)

a need to practice and strengthen interdisciplinarity, share open approach – more cross border service provision,

provision of total service cross wider disciplines: from surveyor to multi-purpose information harvester and provider;

- practical follow-up (1): an inventory of land surveyors activities in the cadastral field of work;
- practical follow-up (2): a list of common characteristics and trends in national regulations;
