

CLRKEN – Work Plan 2016/2017

Aim of this document

The aim of the work plan is to set out and make transparent the activities of the CLRKEN of EuroGeographics for the next 12-24 months.

In that regard, the work plan is a guiding document for the Core Team as well as the other members. It is to be reviewed on a regular basis, ideally annually. It is to be put on the CLRKEN webpages, for all to see.

Mission and objectives of CLRKEN

The mission and objectives of the CLRKEN are to:

- maintain a network of cadastral and land registry experts;
- provide the European platform for networking and sharing best practice;
- follow the development of relevant technologies and practices;
- support EuroGeographics' policy towards European data interoperability;
- promote our member's experiences and expertise;
- raise awareness of the importance of cadastre and land registry for economic activity and social development;
- organize workshops in the field of cadastre and land administration
- publish reports on issues in the field of land administration.

The CLRKEN focuses on the role of cadastre (documenting the property objects) and land registry (documenting legal rights in properties) and investigates developments that affect these fields.

Planned activities of the CLRKEN

The CLRKEN plans the following activities for its members:

- to organize two **workshops** for all CLRKEN members per year, based on the preferences of its members;
- to make accessible the results of these workshops;
- to maintain the **CLRKEN webpages** on the EuroGeographics website.

These activities should be coordinated with other institutions, organizations, and parties active in our field.

Planned actions over the next 12-24 months

2016 *Workshops:* The CLRKEN is planning to hold two workshops, which are both organized jointly with partner organizations:

- Amsterdam, 5-7 June 2016: Common Vision – Migration to a Smart World. Joint Conference of PCC, EULIS, EuroGeographics, CLGE and ELRA.
- Bratislava, 17/18 Nov. 2016: Joint conference PCC-EULIS-CLRKEN.

Future topics: The CLRKEN is carrying out an evaluation of future workshop topics.

Based on the results, it will decide on the theme of the Bratislava workshop and also if the results will be summarized in a report.

CLRKEN Webpages: In order to keep the all CLRKEN members informed, the information about the CLRKEN activities will be published on the webpages on a continuous basis.

After 2016: The CLRKEN will get in contact with the upcoming PCC presidencies well in advance in order to discuss and prepare a possible cooperation:

- 2017: PCC presidencies by Malta / UK
- 2018: PCC presidencies by Estonia / Bulgaria

Common Vision Conference 2017 in Vienna (October 5-6): Joint Conference of PCC, EULIS, EuroGeographics, CLGE and ELRA

Planned activities of the CLRKEN-Core Team

Over the course of one year, the Core Team is planning the following activities:

- to hold 1 **face-to-face meeting** of the Core Team (preferably early in the year): the aim is to review the work plan, to plan and organize up-coming workshops, to coordinate activities with partners, and to decide on workshop topics and possibly a report, dealing with those topics;
- to keep regular contact among the Core Team members through 3-4 **web meetings** per year;
- to organize 2 **workshops** for all CLRKEN members;
- to make workshop results easily accessible for members;
- to maintain **CLRKEN webpages** on the EuroGeographics website.

The "Common Vision" agreement signed on 30 Nov. 2012 by EuroGeographics, PCC, ELRA, and EULIS is the basis for the planning of the CLRKEN activities. We aim to coordinate, organize, and hold our workshops together with those organizations. As in practice the potential overlap in activities is biggest with PCC – in terms of topics and participants – we try to coordinate our activities with the PCC chairs well in advance, as they are changing every 6 months. We will also consider to cooperate more – where possible – with the activities of UN-GGIM:Europe and liaise with other KENs of EuroGeographics.
