

# OPENING UP ACCESS TO DIGITAL TOPOGRAPHIC DATASETS IN THE NETHERLANDS



By making its topographic data freely available, the Dutch Cadastre, Land Registry and Mapping Agency (Kadaster) is meeting national government aims and European Commission policies such as the INSPIRE Directive, the PSI Directive and the initiative regarding the Digital Agenda for Europe.



The Key Register Topography (BRT) contains digital topographical maps at scales of 1:10 000 (TOPI 0NL) to 1:1 million. Data can be downloaded as raster or vector files and is also published as reference map in web portals. It is available at no cost and with a CC BY licence (Creative Commons <http://creativecommons.org/licenses/by/3.0/>).

Since the beginning of 2012, around 12,000 topographical datasets have been delivered on request, a considerable increase on figures before the introduction of open data when the average number of deliveries was round 2,500.
